

INVITATION TO BID

MACKENZIE ROAD PEDESTRIAN IMPROVEMENTS

Sealed bids will be received by the undersigned at the Lummi Indian Business Council, Public Works conference room, 2nd floor, 2665 Kwina Road; Bellingham, WA 98226 up to 2:00 pm local time on April 11th, 2023 and will then and there be opened and publicly read.

All bid proposals must be accompanied by a bid proposal deposit in cash, certified check, cashier's check, money order, or surety bond payable to Lummi Indian Business Council and in an amount of not less than five percent (5%) of the total bid. Should the successful bidder fail to enter into such contract and furnish satisfactory performance bond within the time stated in the specification, the bid proposal deposit shall be forfeited to the Lummi Indian Business Council.

The bids will be evaluated by Lummi Public Works and the Project Engineer based on cost and Contractor qualifications. Owner reserves the right to waive any bid irregularities and to reject any or all bids for any reason, or no reason at all, if it deems that to do so is in the Owner's best interests.

The Mackenzie Road Pedestrian Improvement Project is the construction of an expanded shoulder, curb and gutter, and sidewalk along the northeast side of Mackenzie Road between Eagle Avenue and Lummi View Drive including all stormwater conveyance and treatment infrastructure. The project involves installing a widened pavement section, pedestrian improvements, stormwater conveyance and treatment infrastructure including; temporary erosion control, traffic control, and other work, all in accordance with the attached Contract Plans, these Contract Provisions, and the Standard Specifications.

The Bidder certifies that they will comply with the provisions of the Davis Bacon Act (40 U.S.C. 276a) which applies to contractors and subcontractors performing the work on this federally funded contract in excess of \$2,000 for the construction, alteration, or repair (including painting and decorating) of public buildings or public works.
